<p>As a result of the terrorist attacks on 11 Sep 2001 the Aviation and Transportation Security Act established requirements for training foreign nationals.</p> <p>Colorado Flight Center staff members must be continuously vigilant to any suspicious activities. These activities may include but are not limited to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>a. Paying for training in cash</li><li>b. Showing interest in only certain areas of training but not others necessary for certification.</li><li>c. Suddenly leaving a training program without explanation</li><li>d. Any activity that appears suspicious or inconsistent with the intent to obtain full certification</li><li>e. Individuals on the airport property without apparent reason be there</li><li>f. Persons who desire to rent aircraft without proper credentials</li><li>g. Persons with proper credentials who don't display a corresponding level of aviation knowledge or skill</li><li>h. Any pilot who makes threats or statements inconsistent with normal aircraft operations</li><li>i. Any activity inconsistent with the normal activity of the airport</li><li>j. Any pilot who appears to be under the control of someone else</li></ul> <p>Additionally, Colorado Flight Center Staff members will be continuously vigilant to ensure:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>a. Aircraft are not dispatched without proper authorization</li><li>b. Secured doors, access points, etc. remain locked</li><li>c. Persons without proper access identifications are immediately reported to airport security</li></ul> <p>Staff members will immediately report suspicious activities to the flight school manager, airport authority, or law enforcement as they deem necessary.</p> <p>I certify I have completed the Security Awareness Training required by 49 CFR 1552.23, documentation is attached.</p>
